Marina Bay Sands adds building blocks to Rainbow Centre School

ArtScience Museum hosts students on a tour of The Art of The Brick exhibition and donates 140,000 LEGO® bricks to special needs school

Singapore (21 January 2013) – As part of its Sands for Singapore CSR program, Marina Bay Sands hosted a group of 40 students and 18 teachers from Rainbow Centre Yishun Park School for an afternoon of fun-filled activities at ArtScience Museum at Marina Bay Sands.

The students, aged six to 11 years old, were treated to an exclusive tour of *The Art of The Brick* exhibition before trying their hands on a tote-bag printing activity using these toy building bricks.

In a bid to share these toy building bricks to benefit more children, ArtScience Museum donated 140,000 pieces of the bricks from its Christmas tree last year to Rainbow Centre Yishun Park School. These bricks will be channeled to the school's resource library and classrooms as teaching aids.

After being inspired by *The Art of The Brick* exhibition, the school is also planning to teach students to use these bricks to make a simple Hari Raya themed 2-D structure. This structure will be unveiled as part of the school's Hari Raya celebrations in August.

Mr. Hafiizh Othman, Senior Teacher at Rainbow Centre Yishun Park School, said, "This is such a treat for our students and we are truly delighted to be here today. The Art of The Brick is an amazing exhibition and we can't be more excited to bring these bricks home for our students to learn and play with."
